COVID-19 – Usage of Waterend Rules

The FA asked all facility providers to do a Risk Assessment for their facilities before opening to create a safe environment for teams to train. The rules shown below are only in relation to the usage of Waterend. Each team must do their own Risk Assessment for training and communicate any changes to their teams.

The committee will provide regular oversight at scheduled training sessions to ensure all government guidance in relation to use of the facility is being adhered to. Extra supervision will be provided in the early days of opening to ensure everything is working well.

The committee will provide support and encouragement to help everyone adhere to the government guidelines. Repeat offenders will be subject to the club's disciplinary process. This will include being asked to immediately stop all activity at the facility. The club is being asked to report repeat offenders to the police.

1. Teams will be allocated training times and must remain within these times
 - a. Training times will be staggered to help reduce traffic into and out of the car-park
 - b. Waterend will be separated into Three training Zones, please only use the zone allocated to you.
 - c. Signs will be erected confirming that the General Public must not use Waterend.
 - d. Training must not re-commence if coaches haven't done the following:
 - i. A full Risk assessment of their coaching sessions
 - ii. Communicated the new coaching rules and Waterend rules to parents
2. All visitors to Waterend must follow all government guidelines for hygiene and social distancing.
 - a. Only one family group may use the stairs up to the fields at one time. Signs will be erected to remind visitors of this.
 - b. No close gatherings with parents anywhere at Waterend. 2m distance should be observed by all.
 - c. Parents/carers should bring their children to the training sessions and at least one parent/carer for each child must stay on the field for the duration of training.
 - d. First aid of children will now be the parent's responsibility during sessions.
 - e. Only coaches are allowed to touch or move coach's equipment or club equipment (such as goals).
 - f. Toilets will remain closed until further notice.
 - g. All people should take home their litter and not use the Waterend bins
 - h. People should bring their own hand sanitiser to the facility for use by the players and the parents before and after training. Children should wash their hands prior to coming to training.
 - i. Coaches will be responsible for picking up litter after every session.
3. Additional Support
 - a. The club will attempt to provide additional protective gear for coaches to include hand sanitiser and sanitary gloves. These will be stored in the garage.
 - b. Litter picking equipment is now stored in the Garage and the coaches may use this to help with end of session clean up.
